# *Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time*

*August 1, 2010*

Are you a pack rat? We all have trouble letting go of our possessions. For some, this compulsion to accumulate can become a mental disease appropriately called "disposophobia." There's even a TV show about it---"Hoarding: Buried Alive." The camera goes into homes so unbelievably cluttered that it's difficult to move from room to room.

Jesus told his followers: "Avoid greed in all its forms. A man may be wealthy, but his possessions do not guarantee him life." When Jesus sent the 73 disciples out to preach the good news to the surrounding villages, he told them to travel light, wearing only the clothes on their backs.

In the Disney/Pixar animated movie "Up," 78-year-old Carl Fredrickson tied thousands of balloons to his home. The house rose above the city. At last Carl was free to fulfill his lifelong dream to see the wilds of South America. Later in the story, as balloons were lost, he had to jettison everything to keep the house light enough to fly.

We need to keep ourselves light, too, so our faith can let us fly.

—is the archdiocese's social ministry renewal. Justice, economic justice and peace are interrelated so the topic may be about economic conditions, violence, peace, unemployment, racism, hunger, poverty, disease or promoting life and may be local, national or international.

### Catholic Social Teachings

This week SHINE focuses on the fourth key theme at the heart of our Catholic social tradition. Please read and reflect on the entirety of this theme:

#### Option for the Poor and Vulnerable

A basic moral test is how our most vulnerable members are faring. In a society marred by deepening divisions between rich and poor, our tradition recalls the story of the Last Judgment (Mt 25:31-46) and instructs us to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first.
